I was sent to Lackland Air Force Base for computer schooling and was transferred to Libya, where I kept track of inventory on the Lockheed F-104 Starfighter jets. At the age of 21, I became an A.P. (Air Policeman) and worked closely with local police. When I retired from the Air Force, I became a police officer for D.C. police and then the U.S. Marshalls. I was sent to an FBI school in Quantico, Virginia, to become a technician. I was educated in fingerprints, lab work,

homicides, and other criminal activity. In my career, I became a key player in bringing over 100 crime cases involving homicides and criminal activity to court. One of the big cases I worked on was the Potomac 1982 "Air Florida Flight 90" crash on 14th Street Bridge. I am blessed with three wonderful daughters and five beautiful grandchildren.

Bill's Banana Bread

- 1 cup sugar
- 3 cups flour
 3 ½ teaspoon
- 2 tablespoons of melted butter
- 1 egg
- ¾ cup milk
- 1 cup bananas mashed (3 ripe bananas)
- ¾ cup nuts if desired

• 1 teaspoon salt

baking powder

• 1 cup chocolate chips if desired

Mix butter and sugar until creamy. Mix in eggs, one at a time. Mix in bananas and milk. Once well blended, add in all dry ingredients. Pour into greased pan. Bake for 1 hour at 350 degrees, may add additional 5 minutes depending on your oven. Let cool.
