This month our educational focus has been to in-service staff on the following topics:

- Restraints with emphasis on not locking wheelchairs for residents who are able to independently move in their wheelchairs.
- Abuse Prevention with emphasis on the fact that employees are mandated to report any observation of abuse immediately and review types of abuse.
- Infection Control Procedures for personal items with an emphasis on the need to maintain the shared bathrooms free from any personal items.
- Infection Control Procedures for items in the nourishment refrigerators with an emphasis on the need to date any items in the nourishment refrigerators.
- How to place maintenance work orders to ensure that we address any pest control or maintenance concerns in an efficient and effective manner.

I will begin working with the charge nurses as to their duties to monitor and supervise the care provided to our residents. I continue to be thankful for the opportunity to serve those who have served and to work with the staff toward providing quality care and services. As mentioned last month, I would like to share some of the positive remarks made by families whose loved ones reside in the nursing home. Those remarks can be seen below.
