We are moving through the winter at a rapid pace. It's hard to believe that we are already into February. We have been very fortunate that the weather, to date, has been uneventful. The one snow event we did have was very well supported by all staff. Everyone's dedication to providing uninterrupted services to our veterans is so greatly appreciated.

Also greatly appreciated is the remarkable support Charlotte Hall Veterans Home (CHVH) continues to receive from our cadre of volunteers. Last year we were so blessed to receive 6,436 volunteer hours from individuals and an additional 7,420 volunteer hours from groups. That translates to a total of 13,856 volunteer hours. To put that in perspective, with a normal work year at 2,080 hours, our volunteer hours equaled 6.7 people working forty hours per week. That is really a tremendous gift from so many kindhearted and caring people and organizations. We now look forward to even more volunteer support and success with the input and guidance of our new Volunteer Director, LaDonna Mohler.

The latest Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services Nursing Home Facility Compare Rating has once again reflected our strong leadership and dedicated staff. Charlotte Hall is rated as a 5 STAR facility! Family satisfaction is very important and the annual Maryland Health Care Commission survey consistently ranks Charlotte Hall as a leader in family satisfaction.

UPDATES ON IMPROVEMENTS TO CHVH

• Emergency Generator Replacement Project - Site work to replace/upgrade the emergency generators began July 9, 2012. Many of you have paid close attention to the excavating, underground conduit and manhole placements and back-filling and compacting of the affected areas. That part of the project is nearing completion. What is now taking place is the actual placement of the underground wires that will eventually connect all areas of our building to the new generators through multiple switchgear and switches. The project was originally scheduled to be complete in March of 2013. It now appears that this date will not be met due to a delay in the shipment of some of the necessary components. A new completion date target is not finalized but, be assured, we are in constant contact with the supplier in efforts expedite delivery as best possible.

- Assisted Living Dining Room Expansion The project of expanding the seating space of the 'E' wing dining room has been awarded to the successful bidder. The start of the expansion, which will enclose the porch area on front of the building, is scheduled to begin in the spring. Services and seating capacity of the current dining room will be minimally impacted during the construction period and the room will continue to be available for dining.
- Replacement of the Core, 'A' Wing and 'B' Wing Metal Roofs - This project is currently being engineered for bid. An expected start date for actual roof replacement is scheduled for this summer/fall.
