Janice is a Pennsylvania native who served 22 years in the Navy. A neighbor of hers, who was a Marine, told her that she wouldn't make it through boot camp. This comment became her fuel to get started in the military. Her service took her to Bethesda, Maryland, San Diego, California, and the Philippines. One of her most memorable experiences was when she was a Naval Corpsman, and she had to get on top of a

patient, because she was the smallest, to "bag them" to help them breathe. The people she met during her deployments are what Janice remembers the most. Each deployment differed because of those people. She recalled Chief Anderson, who was her commanding officer. She said that he was very respectful and upfront with her. There was a time when she and a fellow female kept going into his office crying, so he told Janice, "If you keep coming into my office crying, I will kick you out of the Navy. You need to toughen up." Therefore, Janice took that advice, toughened up, and began to make the men cry. This resilient woman learned how to handle the difficulties of being a female in the military and valued her educational milestones. Janice encourages those who want to join because there are a lot of opportunities for jobs, education, and travel. If she could go back to experience anything within her service again, she would love to be able to go to more duty stations.

OUR PARTNER IN THE COMMUNITY:


